
How to Connect to eduroam network using Linux

Connect using Linux


1. Download eduroam installer through the eduroam Configuration Assistant Tool here.


2. Choose University of the Philippines Baguio from the list of organizations.




3. Click eduroam to download. Linux OS is automatically detected.




4. Eduroam installer should appear in downloads folder.




5. Next, install python3. If it is already installed, proceed to step no. 6.




6. After installing python3, go to the Downloads folder.




9. Click Yes to continue.




10. Enter your registered username with @upb.edu.ph.
